As a matter of courtesy it would be appreciated if complementary tickets could be provided to the author for one of the performance nights. A complimentary program if one is produced would also be appreciated.

6. Synopsis

The play is set in a Salvation Army Retirement Home for men. Harry's likes to play cards and in his early days was quite a gambler. Len is now his sparring partner at poker. Their routine is disturbed when Stan, a new boarder, suddenly arrives. Harry is surprised as he and Stan were once long time friends. Len takes to Stan immediately. Stan and Harry have much to talk about and Harry endeavours to make amends for the past

6. Synopsis:

It is audition time again for the local theatre company who are risking a new play and a Director with very advanced ideas. Who will she cast out of the motley crew come to try out? Will the company Chairman finally throttle her? Will the local alcoholic actually audition for something?
Several of the cameo roles could be doubled using wigs and costume changes.

1. Title: '**Beach House**'
2. Author: Mika Logan
3. Cast: 2 Female 1 x 30's 1 x 60's 2 Male same ages.
4. Running time: 30mins
5. Genre: Drama
6. Synopsis.

Sylvie is desperate to own a beach house, and though they can ill-afford it, she eventually wears husband Guy down and they buy a house (with a view of the sea from the upstairs master bedroom window) Catch is, the house is cheap because it has a history, the previous owner committed suicide in the upstairs master bedroom.

Ultimately the dream crumples as both Sylvie and Guy are working more than they can cope with in order to keep up the mortgage repayments, and the clincher occurs when they both arrive separately at the beach house to set up for their house-warming/exorcism party and realize that neither one of them has remembered to pick up the children from pre-school. The play poses the question, 'Happiness, at what cost?'

This play was selected as part of a State Theatre Company development process.

Thrill to the adventures of John and Janet as they experience everything that War can offer. Sympathise with Mum as she throws off the shackles of patriarchy and learns to think for herself. Watch as Dad withdraws into the mouthing of unthinking clichés in order to protect his own bankrupt world view. A comedy for two male and two female actors.

6: Synopsis:

Young Brenton thinks he is on to a good thing when he persuades Mrs. P and her elderly friends to participate in his "Bushes for the Bush" scheme. Unfortunately for Brenton Mrs. P discovers that that these robust seedlings are in fact marijuana plants. Does Mrs. P call the police? No way, she wants a piece of the action. Soon a lot of elderly citizens are enjoying the benefits this very lucrative crop.

5. Genre: A one-act psychological drama for the stage

6. Synopsis:

A woman poses as a reporter and cons a man, who has been found not guilty of murder, into helping her write a book about him. We watch as the woman deftly breaks down the man's defences until she has extracted from him certain information - then she strikes. This psychological thriller is a battle of wits interspersed with relationships, family bonds and the occasional reference to smells.

Her maverick curriculum has also put her on a collision course with her church. The conflict unfolds during the course of the evening's card game. This play is Irish in setting and language.

A disgraced scientist lives in a chookhouse in the bush, where his meals are brought to him regularly by a woman from the Salvation Army. She is not impressed by his claims that the chookhouse contains a four poster and a water bed, nor by the half-human half-chimp figure that lopes across the clearing. Events take a twist when the unlikely couple are joined by a young upwardly mobile businessman, attempting to make his first million by real estate speculation on the chookhouse.

In April 2000 the Book of Kells was damaged en route from Dublin to Canberra (Fact); the true cause of the damage was never revealed. In Northern Ireland a group of mothers, sickened by the atrocities of the conflict, have hatched a plan to pressure the warring parties to seek peace. In Canberra Maeve O’Leary has the Book of Kells at her mercy (Fiction) Three weeks after her action the British Government initiated the first steps on the long road to peace (Fact).

1. Title: **“Mum’s day in 1979 ...the year of the child!”**

3. Cast: 2m 3f (2m 1f are teenagers, older woman 70’s can be voice off.)

4. Running time: 30 minutes

5. Genre: Comedy

6. Synopsis:

It is 1979 - The Year of the Child and Mum is having a bad day. Mum is not very bright in the mornings. Three children and an ageing mother each, in their own way, upset her plans for a day of golf. However, Mum is in full command by evening. Her ageing mother is happy and her three children gracefully accept defeat. Actually, just a normal household!

The doctor is forced to make a decision that goes against his moral and ethical values.

3/ Cast: Six characters all male, can be doubled by three actors in total.

4/ Genre: Thriller.

5/ Running Time: 40 minutes

6/ Synopsis:

Set in the wilds of suburbia in the early 1960s, “Roam Free” is about a teenage boy and his mates celebrating Guy Fawkes Night in rip roaring style. But, perhaps these boys have too much freedom? They are free to roam the streets in pitched battles, blowing up letterboxes, strafing passing cars, almost completely out of control. Someone out there cares enough to do something about them. But, it’s the kind of foul caring that makes these boys’ games pale into insignificance.

6. Synopsis:

'Rules of Engagement' is a wry take on the gyrations of modern romance and its humorous pitfalls. My generation of romantics has had a ringside seat to many rituals in the mating game - from church groups and tennis clubs - to drive-in theatres and beach parties - to the contemporary fashions of cyber romance and speed dating. Throughout it all attitudes to commitment and marriage have proven to be remarkably resilient. But underneath all the constraining influences of religion and new-age philosophies, people still make dodgy promises in intimate circumstances.

Set in the classic Australian space of the public bar, the stories told by Rose, Craig and Suzi invite us to laugh and writhe with discomfort as we see glimpses of ourselves reflected in the wreckage of their serial romances.

'Rules' is a cautionary tale - told in a time of emotional barrenness in a world where love is more important than ever."

5. Genre: Comedy

6. Synopsis:

Mrs Mortimer would like to tango one more time, the problem is Mr Mortimer is, well, dead. Mr Perry, however, can help.

1. Title: **"Thespis' Mask"**

2: Author: Ian McGrath

3: Cast: Minimum 2xM, 3xF; may be extended.

4. Running time: Approx. 35 mins (+)

5. Genre: Fantastic Drama

6. Synopsis :

Using modern language and conventions, "Thespis' Mask" follows Greek tragic format while recounting the legend of Dionysus' birth. A Prologue evokes Greek performance conditions, followed by: Seduction of Semelle, princess of Thebes, by Zeus, lord of Olympus.

Preceded by rustic comic relief, we glimpse the marital antagonism between Zeus and Hera, his consort.

Hera contrives revenge on Semelle.

Zeus perceives he's trapped by Hera.

Rustics prepare for Semelle's nuptial.

Semelle's death, Zeus' remorse and Dionysus' birth.

Elizabeth, Dorothy's birth mother, is reluctant to speak and meet with her. Robert suspects the reason why and the story unfolds in their home.

5. Genre: Drama

6. Synopsis:

Remember the Olden Days? Old Tom does. He remembers a time in the 1940s when, as a lad, he was sent to an orphanage by his mother after she stumbled across an inheritance meant for the boy. This bitter-sweet tale shows such innocence in the young lad and yet lurking behind his story is a secret just bursting to be revealed.

5. Genre: Radio Play (Could be adapted for stage performance.)

6. Synopsis:

Mary reluctantly promised to look after Liz when her mother died ... but the unexpected happened. We find Liz in a nursing home where she has been living for two years. During that time she has never spoken or had any visitors ... until now. Although her body grows Liz's voice and mentality never gets further than fourteen years. Her father died when she was seven. Her mother died in 1990 when Liz was 34. This is her story.
